ACCC PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - SEPTEMBER 2016

I want to thank the membership and Directors of the ACCC for the opportunity to be elected to the Presidency of the Association of California Car Clubs, I am looking forward to working with all of the ACCC Directors ACCC membership and sponsors to continue our fight to keep our classic, collector, antique and special interest vehicles on the roads in California.

Although there have been some disappointments in our elected officials at the State Capitol to rally behind the car hobby in California, there has also been some good out of all of our efforts.

Assemblyman Gatto's AB 1658, introduced in 2012, created the California Legacy License Plate Program which was a major accomplishment by all involved. The new plates, can be ordered by anyone, regardless of their car's age. Black plates can be personalized, like other plates, and plates will also be available for motorcycles. The plates are made from the same molds the original were -- molds the DMV discovered at Folsom Prison, where the classic plates used to be made.

I want to thank our past President Rex Roden for the excellent work and contribution he has made to the ACCC for the past years. I will be working with him and the ACCC Directors in this upcoming legislation year as we all know that there has been and most likely will be legislators and appointed bureaucrats at the State Capitol that will try to get our vehicles off the California roads. 2017 will be even more challenging and I sincerely hope that I can depend on all of the memberships help in accepting these

challenges with the determination of supporting the legislation that is good for the hobbyist and businesses that help keep our cars on the roads and opposing the legislation that is detrimental to our hobby. There has been talk in the past about the possibility of forming a Car Club Council in Northern California. I will be meeting with the San Diego Association of Car Clubs (San Diego Car Club Council) at their February 2017 meeting to get information about this subject.

I have been involved with SEMA/SAN for the past 15 plus years in organizing a group of car enthusiasts to attend the yearly SEMA Show in Las Vegas. I hold a meeting during the show with guest speakers which include legislators from California and other states involved with the car hobby in their respective states. In the past, the SEMA Action Network (SAN) has been very supportive in providing speakers from Utah, New York, Oregon, Wyoming, Dave McClelland (Voice of NHRA), Doug Evans, David Freiburger (Editor in Chief of Hot rod and Hot Rod Deluxe magazines), GM Performance on the E-Rod LS3 Motor, etc.

SEMA/SAN has provided a conference room and guest credentials each year for the enthusiasts. The SEMA Show is not open to the public and we are very fortunate to have developed a good relationship with our friends in the automobile aftermarket. We are all working toward the same mission.
