DISNEY FAMILY MUSEUM VISIT -AUGUST 21st

Yes, we really did visit the museum. We got tickets for 10:20 a.m. admission and were able to park directly in front of the entrance shown on the front page.

Again, we were a small group, Jim Wagner, Rosie & Steve Rhodes and Vern Hance.

The Museum is pretty large and fills two stories of the historic brick structure. It starts with a large room displaying a myriad of awards and trophies that document Disney's ascent to fame.

Next we proceeded through the many rooms that show the struggles of Walt and his brother Roy as well as Disney's parents challenged seeking prosperity. Then more rooms with documents and highlights and low lights that led eventually to success.

Walt Disney was born in Chicago in 1901 to his parents Elias and Mary, who were born in Canada and later moved to the U.S. They moved to a farm in Missouri in 1904 and later to a farm in Kansas. They were not wealthy and struggled to succeed in several business ventures.

Walt and his brother Roy started the Walt Disney Company in 1923, after going bankrupt in Kansas. They operated out of a small office in Los Angeles and focused on short animated movies, always looking for advances by adding color and later sound. The struggling company finally achieved lasting success when the Snow White movie became an instant success in the mid 1930s.

Other animated movies and the creation of many characters, such as Micky Mouse, Donald Duck, Pluto, etc allowed the company to prosper, with Disneyland opening in 1955 and Disney World in 1971.

Roy Disney, Walt's older brother continued to be an important team member contributing to the company's success. He died in 1971 at age 78.

Walt Disney died in 1966 at age 65. His daughter Diane married Ron Miller, who became CEO of Disney for about 3 years, until he was forced out by Michael Eisner in 1984.

The Disney Family Museum opened in 2009 in the S.F. Presidio and was designed by Disney's daughter Diane and her son (Walt's grandson) Walter E. D. Miller. Bothe Diane and her husband Ron Miller still live in Northern California.

The Museum visit was interesting, but is so extensive that it calls for another visit to appreciate all the the displays.
